



One of the oldest cemeteries in the area contains tombstones dating back to 1863. Prominent names in the tiny plot near Muskrat Lake, are Wallace, Allen, Potter, Spencer and Livingstone. The weather-worn stone markers appear to have been moved from their original site to a small, fenced-in burial ground.
