ELECTROCUTION

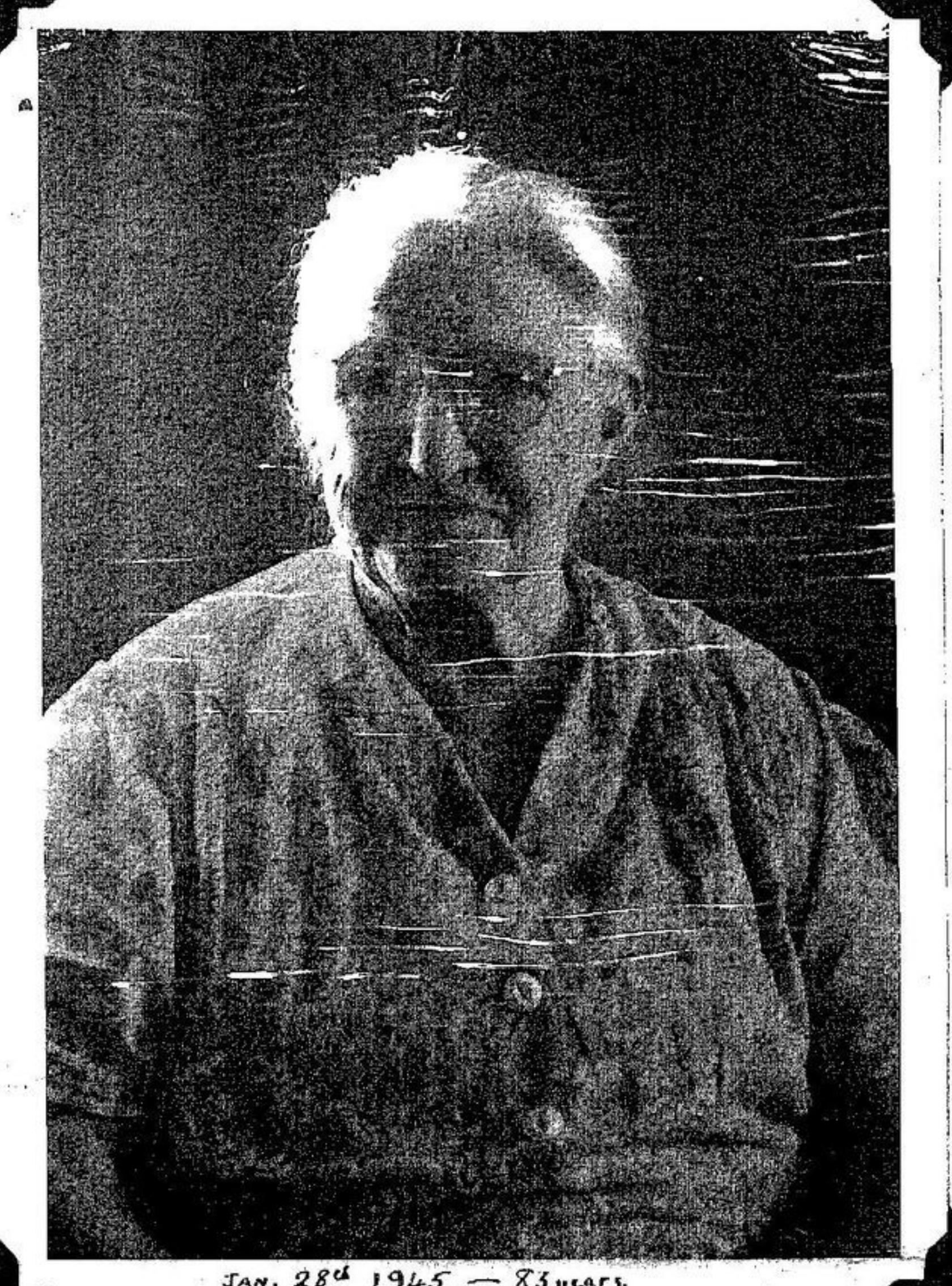

Mr. Webster was born on the farm concession of Ashfield in the County of Lakerow, Ontario, on January 14, 1870, and married Elizabeth Ann Webster in 1904. He occupied the old homestead till 1911. When Cochrane came to the farm he came North locating a farm south of town in Lakerow township and the family moved North.

Mr. Webster never married again. He was a member of the Wesleyan Church and was a member of a prayer society. In 1923 their home was burned with all its contents. There was a woman for all at the Webster home, whose eye had been blind since she was a child. His passing leaves a blank that can never be filled.

He leaves to mourn their loss his widow, 7 sons and 1 daughter.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Stanley Smith, pastor of the church, and the body was laid to rest in the local cemetery.
