An inter-town junior bowling competition is planned for Dec. 1, in Ansonville with bantam, junior and intermediate teams from the Monteith area competing against teams in the same grouping from the Ansonville area.

Teams will consist of three boys and three girls who hold the highest averages in their respective groupings. Robert Stones will be on hand to conduct the tournament.

### Monteith Wins Bowling Tourney

Monteith bowlers took two of three events in the junior bowling tournament in Ansonville Saturday.

In the bantam division, Ansonville took top honors by a 1,319 to 1,215 count. Monteith won the first game 719 to 697, but Ansonville bounced back to take the second game 622 to 496.

Monteith emerged victorious in the junior division by the slim margin of 28 pins. Monteith won the first game 717 to 571, lost the second 797 to 679, but won the round with a 1,396 total compared to 1,368 for Ansonville.

In the intermediate class, Monteith walked off with top honors again. In the first game, Monteith won 875 to 760 only to have Ansonville win the second 879 to 797. However, Monteith's big edge in the first game stood up as they won the round 1,672 to 1,639.

Trophies were presented to the boy and girl with the high average by Bob Soanes, president of the Canadian Junior Bowling Council. Ray Lamarche of Ansonville, an intermediate, was the winner for the boys with 289; while Dorian Lariere, a bantam, was the best of the girls with 187.

Other individual leaders were: bantam, Fred McGee of Monteith, 191; junior, Allan Jones of Monteith, 197, and Diane Bijou of Ansonville, 165; and intermediate Linda Irvin of Monteith, 180.
