The farm's main building has an interesting background. At one time it was a private school and in 1937 it was taken over by the department of reform institutions for two years as a branch of the Burwash Industrial Farm.

In 1940 it was turned over to the federal government for use as a prisoner of war camp until 1947 when it was turned back to the department as a reform institution.

Mr. Irvine has spent many years with the reform department of the Province serving in various capacities,

Starting as a guard in one institution, he has held posts as sergeant at the Monteith farm, assistant superintendent at the Mimico institution, inspector of reform institutions which took him throughout the Province, and then three years igo was appointed superintenlent at Monteith.
