Mrs T. J. McDowell gave an address "Value of Convention" - gives us new contacts and keeps us in touch with W. Institute work.

Value of Federation: Each representative brings to the Federation a contribution from her own locality. This Board consists of women who have worked up from a member - a representative must have at least (3) three years experience in Women's Institute Executive work, and be familiar with Women's Institute work in its different phases.

Our Federated fees are returned to us in service from the Federated Board. (1) Federated Representative travelling expenses paid travelling to Conventions or Board Meeting. (2) Helps to maintain "Home and Country". (3) Relief fund to transport bales to the North. (4) Finances Song Sheets and Hand-book service. Federation and Department of Institutes' Branch work very closely - affiliated with Federated Women's Institute of Canada and with Associated Country Women of the World (Mrs. Watt. present president - ^{Ac. W. W.} is a Canadian).

Federation receives many demands on its funds. In 1939 helped to entertain the group of Scottish women who toured Canada. She explained the "Voluntary Registration of Women".
