

Resolutions Committee.

In this instance, Miss Clarke explained that the Convener of Legislation and Resolutions for the District should be the Convener of Resolutions for the Convention Area.

An Invitation was extended from the South to hold the 1941 Convention at New Liskeard. - Accepted.

The Report on Health and Child Welfare was given by Mrs. C. Clifford, Monteith. Among the topics studied were Food, Clothing, Exercise, Prevention of Certain diseases Treatment of T. B, Care of School Children. - Help was given to the Red Cross, to the Local hospital and to the schools. Layettes and First Aid Kits were provided where needed.

The Report on Education by Mrs. L. Morrissey, Charlton Papers were given on important subjects. There were Educational Roll Calls, Inter-school Contests and debates Institutes co-operate with the schools, and make use of the Travelling Library.

Discussion on these Reports was led by Mrs. Duke, who stressed the importance of health Education (especially for children) as our children of to-day are to be, our citizens of to-morrow.

Miss Clarke followed up the discussion by encouraging Institutes to take the Health Magazine, for use among the members. She referred to the "Pasteurization of Milk Act and Serum" against diphtheria - commended both as being necessary. In Education, she said to have biographies of people, who are shaping the destinies of our country. She recommended Educational Contests, as it gives all members a chance to take part. Reports should be read more slowly, so that members can jot down some topics for help in Programme planning.
