Current Activities

- Middlesex Women for the Support of Agriculture's education committee have established a permanent display and March Break Showcase on Agriculture at the Regional Children's Museum in London.
- The Women's Community House in London is conducting a three-month long study on the resources which exist for battered women in Middlesex County to determine the viability of a safehome network for the county. Funded by the Ministry of Community and Social Services, the feasibility study will investigate the possibility of placing a community development person in the area to better co-ordinate the rural and community services in Middlesex County to help battered women. - Ruscom Women's Institute passed a resolution at its meeting opposing the application of CNCP Telecommunications to deregulate the long distance monopoly of Bell Canada. It is to be voted upon at the area's District Annual meeting in May.
- Women Today, Huron County, is participating in a research project to gather information on rural women's use of the criminal justice system in situations of wife assault. Members will be interviewing women who have been abused to determine what help the police, lawyers and court system has been to them and will gather information on how to improve the provision of services.
- Women for the Survival of Agriculture, Eastern Ontario, is preparing an Agri-business Careers Day scheduled for some time in October.
- Middlesex Women for Support of Agriculture's Education Committee has come up with a list of possible projects: sponsorship of a follow-up professional development day for the county's grade three teachers on the new unit of 'Good Things Grow in Ontario''; co-operation with the county agrologists during career week to focus on careers in the food system; approaching the federal Minister of Agriculture re implementing agriculture in the classroom on a national scale; development of a resource list of farms willing to take schools on a farm tour so that it does not become a burden for a few to act as hosts; correspond with the London Board of Education to see if they wish any assistance.
- Middlesex Women for Support of Agriculture is asking that farmers write letters to their MPs, John Wise, federal Minister of Agriculture, and Michael Wilson, Minister of Finance, to let them know how farmers feel about the white paper on agriculture recently released by the federal finance department.
