Sources can be family records, letters, documents, relatives and their family records.

Records of countries and cities where ancestors lived.

Government records such as land grants, assessment records help. Church records, birth records, marriage and death records furnish valuable information.

Another valuable source, if you can get cooperation, is previous census taking.

Some libraries such as public and newspaper libraries have information. Cemeteries are invaluable for information as to birth, marriage and death.
