

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

Mrs C. K. Blackburn read the Citizenship and Education report seconded by Mrs Benson. carried

Mrs M. Young, as Public Relations Officer told of the A. C. W. W. contributions amounting to 25⁶⁵. She explained the emergency resolution re Dental Facilities for Rural Districts, and told of the correspondence she had had regarding the resolutions presented in 1954.

Miss Isobel Leslie W. J. Branch Department of Agriculture gave her report. She asked that Branches study their funds carefully, give locally or send their delegates to conventions. This she felt should come first. Do not do too much work for nation wide organizations. She said the Home Services were not restricted to W. J. members, but were a means of obtaining new members. Have a project one year but change to a new one the following year. Do not discuss politics or religion at meetings. She told of the different courses, explaining each one and asked that each branch give date and second date. She explained that the 1956 Conference would be for Secretary, Treasurer chosen alphabetically as to Branches.
