Mrs. Cosson reported on Homemaking club work and mentioned that only young person under 26 yrs. of age can be eligible to belong to these clubs. B.I. Sponsorship includes sending leaders to training schools, (transportation and lunch). Help leaders find suitable place to hold meetings. They need poster stands to display finished articles. Suggest 24 I Branches give each club 2 or 3 to cover small expenses. Up to leader to submit expenses to branch and report of activities. Have club girls at meetings and ask them questions suggest asking them to help serve when serving tea or catering. Attending summer day a good way to become interested in club work. The club girls motto is "When you start something see it thru to the end." Mrs. Cosson said she is leaving this territory and going to Toronto and hoped that we would give her successor the same co-operation we had given her.

Mrs. S.C. Clement gave her report of board meeting in Toronto mentioned that Mrs. Lyndburn would be attending the A.C.S.I. Convention in Australia in October.

The proceeds of the International scholarship would be used to send a home economist to undernourished countries. She also said that there are 1600 U.H. clubs and 3500 I.I. branches and 26,079 life members in Ontario. Also that 254 children had been adopted in Canada thru the Save the Children Fund. Citizenship & Education kits are available from Loan Library. Also the I.I. cups & saucers are to be 50¢.

Mrs. Clement also noted the fact that Mrs. Archie Weatherington of New Lispeard had received 4th prize in A.C.S.I. 24th essay contest. She also suggested that scrap books on the history of the community be placed in library.

Community singing followed led by Mrs. R.A. Reddie. Mrs. M. Young then gave a report on F.I.S.I.C. Convention held in Vancouver in June 1961. Read history of dog wood tree as the flower is B.C. National flower.
