 notes they be cancelled.

 of April meeting read. President was unable to
 preside & so a new one was elected. New
 President Mrs. Cooper. further business left to
 another meeting.

Dec. 1919. Mrs James 34 present a silver
 collection taken for the "Muskegon Free Hospital"

Jan. 6. 1920 meeting Mrs Cooper 17 present
 of which 13 were members. There being \$164.16 left
 in the Red Cross Fund, the ladies discuss what to do
 with it. Some were in favour of a "War Memorial"
 some in favor of donating to hospitals where it would
 do more good. so it goes undecided. President
 proposed we obtain a travelling library from
 Department of Agriculture all agreed.
