I think it would be wise to go a further step and make a by-law about the rates for your hall. This would require a notice of motion of thirty days, every member must be notified and there must be an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present. The person who makes the notice of motion states it is exact regarding the motion in the notice, and there can be no discussion of it then. After the motion is made and the notification of the members, she states the motion at a meeting, motion is taken, the notice is seconded, discussed and then vote is taken.
