April 1942.

PURPOSES OF ENTERPRISE

1. To process and pack jam for the use of civilian victims of war in Britain, Canadian troops in hospitals or camps overseas or Military Hospitals in Canada or needy British evacuees in Canada or wherever the need may be greatest. All jam suitable for shipment overseas will be sent to Britain.
2. To permit a voluntary contribution of surplus fruit for the satisfaction of the physical and psychological needs of civilians on the front line and of men on active service.

ORGANIZATION OF ENTERPRISE

I. RED CROSS SOCIETY - National and Divisional

1. To provide cans, labels and cases.
2. To provide transportation for the above to local Red Cross branches and for filled cans from local Red Cross Branches to the final destination.
3. To distribute recipes to local Red Cross branches.
4. To keep Divisional records.
5. To test and ship jam.
6. To arrange for necessary educational work.

II. WOMEN'S INSTITUTE BRANCH, Ontario Department of Agriculture.

1. To provide all necessary directions and information for Women's Institutes co-operating.
2. To provide directions and recipes for making jam.
3. To co-operate with Divisional Red Cross in record keeping, testing and distribution of jam.
4. To arrange for necessary educational work.

III. LOCAL GROUPS

Red Cross Branches and Women's Institutes co-operating:

1. To establish a representative committee to plan and carry on the project locally and to work with the Divisional Red Cross and the Women's Institute Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture.
2. To provide fruit.
3. To provide sugar.
4. To arrange local publicity.
5. To arrange for local distribution and return of cans to Red Cross Branch.
6. To arrange for making jam, supervision, and testing of finished product.
7. To keep necessary records for the Provincial offices.

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
