

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

Date... May 16, 1962 Place... Easton Catholic Church, Lacombe

Mrs. Clement stated that she had enjoyed her experience in acting for Mrs. Humphries on the Provincial Board, and reporting at the District Annual and extended good wishes to all. Mrs. Schenk thanked Mrs. Clement for her splendid report. At this time Mrs. H. C. Bailey, Past President, presented the promised gift of a T.I. cup and saucer when available for Mrs. L. Humphries, retiring Board Director. Mrs. Clement accepted same and promised to pass it on, with all good wishes from Centre Lemiskaming District.

Mrs. H. Cosson, reporting for 4-H Homemaking Clubs, stated that the club membership had almost doubled from fall to spring units, which was indeed encouraging. She announced that Achievement Day for "Supper Club" would be held in Englehart, June 2 and invited all members and friends to attend. Mrs. Cosson then gave an outline of "What it means to sponsor a club," pointing out choosing leaders with some ability and an interest in girls is important, that branches should pay leaders' expenses and make suitable arrangements for other expenses of the club. Club members should be willing to bring food for cooking units and supply sewing material as necessary. Girls might be asked to help out at Institute teas, bazaars or bake sales. Branches are asked to pay for County Honour Pins for club girls who have earned same and should constantly show an interest and enthusiasm for club work. Mrs. Cosson stated that she would be leaving Lemiskaming in July, that she had enjoyed her work here and that she appreciated the fine support of all branches during her term as Home Economist for Lemiskaming.
