She urged the use of exercise franchise - that fees be paid not later than Feb. 1. She gave the address of the Fairfield Woolen Mills - Postage Avenue Winnipeg where by sending 7 1/2 pounds of wool plus \$1.50 a blanket could be obtained.

Branches disbanded must dispose of property a 2/3 vote to decide what to do with money on hand and must not start up again within a year. Conventions should be well advertised on radio - put on membership drives - encourage Jr. groups. Mrs. Ross compared Canada and Russia and stated we & Russia need to be friends and trade. The W.I. has helped the N.P. I.B. - the Central further to help War Services etc. That there is always need for the W.I. outside the home - we should look about for opportunities - work through the teachers - we should welcome Dr. War Budd and take them into our hearts.

A W.I. song book is to be printed. She suggested that instead of building a monument for the fallen that we put money into school gardens etc. In closing Mrs. Ross thanked the District and branches for their support.
