

Sept. 2, 1942

The Thonbea Women's Institute met on Sept 2nd, at the home of Mrs. J. E. Cragg with an attendance of ten members and three visitors.

The President occupied the chair and opened the meeting with the Aids, followed by Roll Call, which was answered by "A Community Improvement"

The minutes of the last meeting were then read, and upon motion of Mrs. Ward, recorded and carried, were adopted.

Mrs. Ward then reported that four boxes had been packed by herself and Mrs. Pratt and mailed on Aug. 12th to Clair Miller, Bill Swayne, Donald Edwards and Bill Ward. Each box contained an 8-oz tin of Spik, small tin peaches, biscuits, pkg. of gum, Lifesavers, toffee and peanuts. Cost of contents \$3.82, postage \$1.52, total cost \$4.82. There was some discussion of future boxes and when they should be sent but it was left to the discretion of Mrs. Pratt and Mrs. Ward.

The correspondence was then read, consisting of a letter regarding the U. S. War Savings Stamp Folder, one about the Convention to be held in Cochrane Sept. 29 + 30, and one from Mr. Scott regarding addresses of local boys for the Legion's list. The Stamp Folders were distributed to all present. It was decided not to send a regular delegate to the Convention on account of the expense. Mrs. Ross will bring back a report to us if she attends in her capacity of Federated Representative.
