

# Old St. Andrew's Church celebrates 150th anniversary

TORONTO - On Sunday, Dec. 28, 1980, following a service at 2:30 p.m., a plaque commemorating historic Old St. Andrew's, Colborne, will be unveiled inside the church.

The historical plaque is being erected by the Ontario Heritage Foundation, an agency of the ministry of culture and recreation which is dedicated to the promotion and preservation of Ontario's cultural heritage.

The unveiling ceremony is the last event celebrating the 150th anniversary of the erection of the church and is being sponsored by the congregation of St. Andrew's.

A director of the Ontario Heritage Foundation will present the plaque to the church and it will

be unveiled by Mrs. Christine Chatterson, a long-time member of the parish and its first woman elder.

Others invited to participate in the ceremony include: Harry Bradley, minister at St. Andrew's who will act as program chairman; Walter Rutherford, reeve of Colborne; Charles Reynolds, clerk of session; George Hees, MP (Northumberland); and Russell Rowe, MPP (Northumberland).

Duncan McGlennon, a parishioner, will give a brief history of St. Andrew's and, following the unveiling, Mr. Bradley will dedicate the plaque.

Refreshments will be served in the church hall at the close of the ceremony.
