Police catching cigarette smugglers


Brighton OPP report that, since Nov. 10, 1993, they have stopped a total of 12 vehicles for offences under the Excise Act.

Two vehicles were involved in carrying contraband liquor; 10 were carrying cases cigarettes or tobacco products.

Altogether 192 cases of cigarettes and 10 cases of loose tobacco have been seized. All 12 vehicles were impounded by police and a total of 16 suspects were arrested.

The total value of illegal cigarettes detected in this manner was \$434,000. Total value of seized liquor was not given in the report.
