No gym without twp. support

Castleton Public School is in need of an expensive upgrade but is unlikely to get it without financial support from Cramahe Township.

The school requires a \$2.6-million upgrade, part of which would include a \$600,000 for a new general-purpose room.

The board thinks that room could be built as a freestanding facility and is willing to contribute \$300,000 toward the project construction.

The balance of the money would have to be provided by the township or by community and sports groups who would use the building.

Discussions have been ongoing between the board, the Castleton principal and the community.

"It seems like there's a lot of interest in building (the general purpose room), but there's no money," said superintendent of

business Ron Sudds.

He said the township could use funds from the national infrastructure-improvement program to finance the gym, but that

would still be expensive.

For every two dollars of federal-provincial infrastructure money, the municipality must chip in a dollar.
