Cramahne library struggles with smaller grants, more costs

The Cramahne Township Library Board says it is forced to ask council for \$1,000 more than last year, to overcome declining revenues from the province and other sources. Board chairman Alvin Jones attended a recent

Cramahne council meeting to ask for \$6,000 this year, up from \$5,000 last year. Mr. Jones told the board that \$1,867 less would be coming to the library this year from the province of Ontario — a 20 per cent reduction in funding from the previous year. Increasing expenses — including insurance pre-

miums — and decreasing help, especially from SOLS (Southern Ontario Library Service), have put the library in Castleton in a tight spot, the chairman explained. At the mention of insurance, Deputy Reeve Jim Williams pricked up his ears and wondered aloud if the library couldn't get

cheaper insurance through the municipality. Mr. Jones said insurance costs the library about \$400 a year. Township administrator Gerry Morrison went one better when he suggested the library may already be insured through the township's municipal policy. The library is housed in

the township hall. "Maybe we're double-insuring," Mr. Morrison suggested. He said he would look into the matter. A decision on the library board's request for an increased grant will have to await council's budget deliberations, scheduled to begin March 21.
