

# Crammahe to end year with accounts in the black

In a brief report to Crammahe council on Dec. 16, township administrator Gerry Morrison announced that the township is currently about \$60,000 under budget for 1996.

Big savings in roads maintenance, capital, and equipment more than offset decreased grants and smaller revenues for garbage tags, he said.

Since June 1, the township has sold 19,500 garbage tags at \$1 each. The estimated sales had been \$27,000.

Based on these figures the township expects to sell about 33,000 next year.

Mr. Morrison explained the tag revenues in detail. The cost of the tags covers only the cost of collection of the bags. It does not

cover the tipping (disposal) cost of the wet garbage or the cost of sorting the dry materials.

Northumberland County charges the township \$115 per tonne for landfilling wet garbage and \$110 per tonne for processing of dry (largely reusable) materials.

For the township to collect enough to cover the full cost of the wet/dry

program through the tag system, cost of tags would have to be set at \$2.50 apiece, he estimated.

But council indicated that it was not their intention to have the tag fee cover the total cost, and there was no suggestion that tag prices be increased.

The area of largest savings in 1996 was in maintenance where \$28,000

was shaved from anticipated costs. Mr. Morrison expects that the township will be under budget from \$20,000 to \$40,000 when all bills are finally in, after Dec. 31.
