




## \$2,600 Collected By United Church

Spent \$950 on Renovation of Edifice

Alton, Jan. 20 (Special)—Reports presented at the annual meeting of Alton United Church showed that during 1939 over \$2,600 was contributed. Nine hundred and fifty dollars of this was spent on renovating the church. There was a decided increase in membership.
