



## KANNAWIN ELECTED 1934 DEPUTY-REEVE

McBride, McLeish and Evans Win Three Council Seats in Caledon.

Slightly over 1050 votes were polled in Caledon's municipal contest on Monday. In the fight for the Deputy-Reeve's chair, Sam. Kannawin of the 1934 council won rather handily from his colleague, William Hawkins. The candidates live in the Alton ward and here the vote was split pretty evenly, Kannawin emerging from the fray with a lead of 11 votes. Elsewhere the winner polled substantial majorities. Kannawin, who has a lengthy municipal experience, was better known than his opponent. Hawkins, too, declined to do any canvassing. The winner is an experienced man and a careful administrator.

Albert D. McBride, of Belfountain, led the field in the race for council seats. He polled a bumper vote in his home division and rolled up another heavy vote in Alton, also running (well in the other divisions with the exception of the Caledon East ward. He was followed by Alex. McLeish, another new man, who ran particularly well in the Caledon ward and polled a good vote over the township. The fight for third place was between T. R. Evans, of Caledon East, and W. J. Trathen, of the 1934 council. Evans won out, solely by virtue of the heavy vote he received in his home division. Elsewhere Trathen had the advantage, but his lead was not sufficient to offset the large Evans majority at Caledon East. The winner has had previous municipal experience in Caledon. Norman Storey, of Belfountain, finished fifth and last place went to Hugh Potter, a new-comer in Caledon municipal politics. The results follow:
