## New Disease Warning Given

TORONTO, May 27 — (CP) — Dr. A. T. Thomas Rhodes of the Toronto School of Hygiene today warned public health workers to be on the lookout for a new disease diagnosed as a combination of aseptic meningitis and German measles.

He said the hundreds of children in the Toronto area who were attacked with the disease last summer were the first known cases in North America. About 100 were ill enough for hospital treatment.

The disease attacks young children and adults mainly, Dr. Rhodes said. Symptoms include frontal headache, muscular pain, drowsiness, rash on the face, limbs, soles of the feet and palms of the hand.

## WRECKAGE FOUND

Wreckage of a Trans-Canada Air Lines plane that carried 62 persons to their deaths last December has been found on Mount Slesse, 20 miles south-east of Chilliwack.

The plane vanished after turning back to Vancouver from an eastbound flight because of engine trouble. Search was made for the plane but had to be abandoned because of winter weather conditions.
