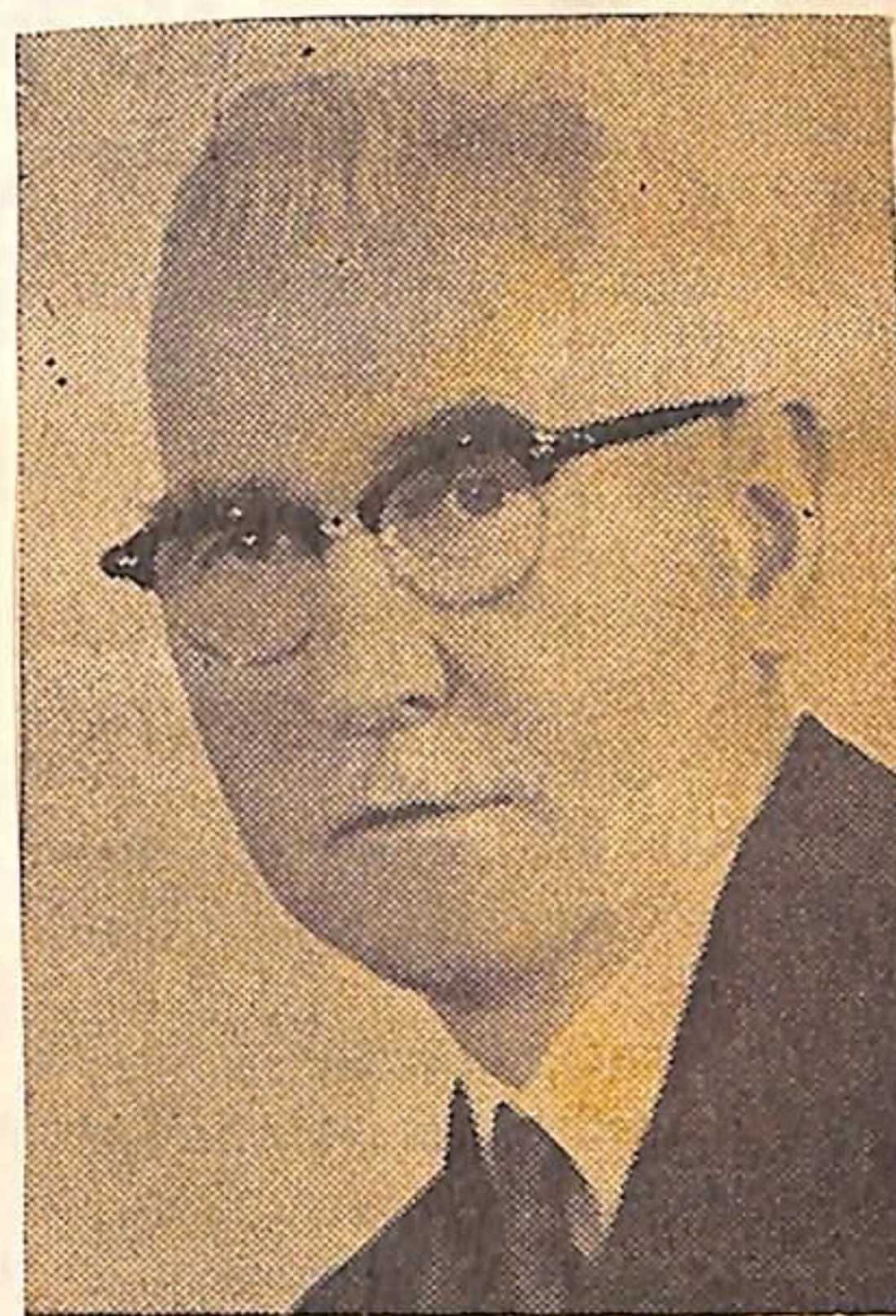

Tory Tide Raises Robinson to Third Term, Inundates Liberal

Andrew Robinson of Kincardine won third term endorsement as Member of Parliament for Bruce Monday and helped swell the imposing total of Progressive Conservatives elected in Canada-wide tidal wave of votes which inundated the St. Laurent administration and the candidacy in this riding of Liberal Donald Blue, who met Mr. Robinson for a third time.

Pre-election estimates of a close contest in Bruce went by the boards as Robinson majority of 324 in 1953 ballooned to 2175 lead Monday, one of the largest ever accorded any Bruce candidate.
