

In 1840 the land was divided and given to John B. Henry's sons. His youngest son, John, inherited this 100 acres. John had no children and left his land to his widow, Caroline, who sold it to John and Jacob Stouck in 1901. John died in 1956 and bequeathed the house and property to his son, Henry. Kate (Mrs John Stouck) died in June 1958. She was a valued member of the Beamsville Women's Institute for a number of years.
