
## Grimsby native, 57, oldest Canadian to swim Channel


Do you remember where you were on Thursday, July 27, at approximately 10:05 p.m.? Vincent Pogachar, a native of Grimsby, definitely does.

Mr. Pogachar was standing knee deep in the English Channel, about two miles from Calais, France, ecstatic about having just swam across that famous body of water.

Not only did Mr. Pogachar become the 368th person to complete the channel crossing from England to France but, at 57 years of age, he became the oldest of 11 Canadians to have conquered the channel, and the third-oldest of anybody who has met the challenge.
