Mrs. J.A. Morris



1964--1966

Mrs. Morris and her sister, Miss Alice Jelly, moved to a new house on the fourth line west, in January 1961 and that same year both joined the Belfountain-Rockside Women's Institute. She immediately took an active part in both the Institute and community.

Mrs. Morris became the fourth Curator of the Tweedsmuir History Book, succeeding Mrs. W.H. Miller, who had completed Her second term as Curator.

Mrs. Morris was born in Shelburne, Ont, Dec.25, 1896, and during the first World War worked with the ~~War~~ Purchasing Department in Ottawa. Later she was Credit Manager of a Book Publishing Firm in Toronto until her marriage to J.A. Morris in 1924. After his death in 1948 she succeeded him as President of Miller, Morris Ltd., until 1959.

The Institute lost another faithful member and good friend when, after a lengthy illness, she died in Toronto, Feb. 25, 1966.

Mrs. Stewart Scott



1966-1972

Mrs. Stewart Scott became the fifth Curator of the History Book holding that office for six years.

Mrs. Scott joined the Belfountain-Rockside Women's Institute Branch in 1920 and served as President in 1949-1951. She held several other offices throughout the years and contributed much to the success of her Branch. In the District she was a Convener for three years.

In May 1954 Mrs. Scott was given a Branch Life Membership.

Mrs. Scott has worked on the History Committee through the years helping to compile the history before it is lost to the future generation.

After marrying W.B. Laughlin and moving to Belfountain from Oakville, she joined the Institute in June 1957 and served as president 1963-1969, and 1975-1977, also as both an auditor and a convener at District level. She served in other offices throughout the years and was always a willing worker and hostess. She acted as chairman of the history book committee which accomplished the publishing of "Belfountain" Caves, Castles and Quarries, having for its base the Tweedsmuir History Book.
