Baldwin. "He was very generous to the Foundation. He donated \$45,000 over the past few years."


Baldwin said the funds will be invested until the foundation gets the go ahead for the Kincardine Hospital redevelopment, which at that point will determind how best to use the funds.

Kincardine author Arlene McFarlane releases second book in mystery series


Kincardine's rlene McFarlane released the second book of the series, *Murder, Curlers and Canes*, on June 15.
