Sounds Almost Like "Uncle Tom"

Down in St. Louis, Missouri, there's a magazine published called "The Auction News-Letter." To Mr. E. R. O'Neil, the well-known Auctioneer of Denfield, we are indebted for the following intensely interesting item, which we reproduce, word for word, just as it appeared.

Missouri Sale Bill of 1846

The following auction bill is quoted from "THE AUCTIONEER." The item was submitted by Jas. A. Elliott of Marwayne, Alberta and was originally clipped from the Hanna Herald:

"State of Missouri, County of Pike.

"To Whom it May Concern:

"The undersigned will, Tues., Sept. 29, A.D. 1846, sell at Public Outcry, for cash, on premises where Coon Creek crosses the Missouri road, the following chattels, to wit:

Nind yoke of oxen with yokes and chains; two wagons with V beds; three nigger wenchies; four buck niggers; three nigger boys; two prairie plows; twenty-five steel traps; one barrel pickled cabbage; one hogshhead of tobacco; one lot fo nigger hoes; one spinnig wheel, loom; three fox hounds; a lot of dorn; mink and skunk skins, and a lot of other articles.

"Am gwine to California.
