Held at the Masonic Hall, the display featured everything from a rifle used in the Boer War to a collection of old photographs. Antiques and old-fashioned clothing were also on display. The items were borrowed from residents in the community.

One of the largest drawing cards for the two day event was a 287 page booklet on the history of Kintore. The 100 copies prepared for the event quickly ran out Friday afternoon and orders were being put in for more.

The three weeks of research carried out by the three girls was financially assisted by the Kintore Women's Institute, the Kintore Optimists, East Nis-souri Junior Farmers, and advertisers.
