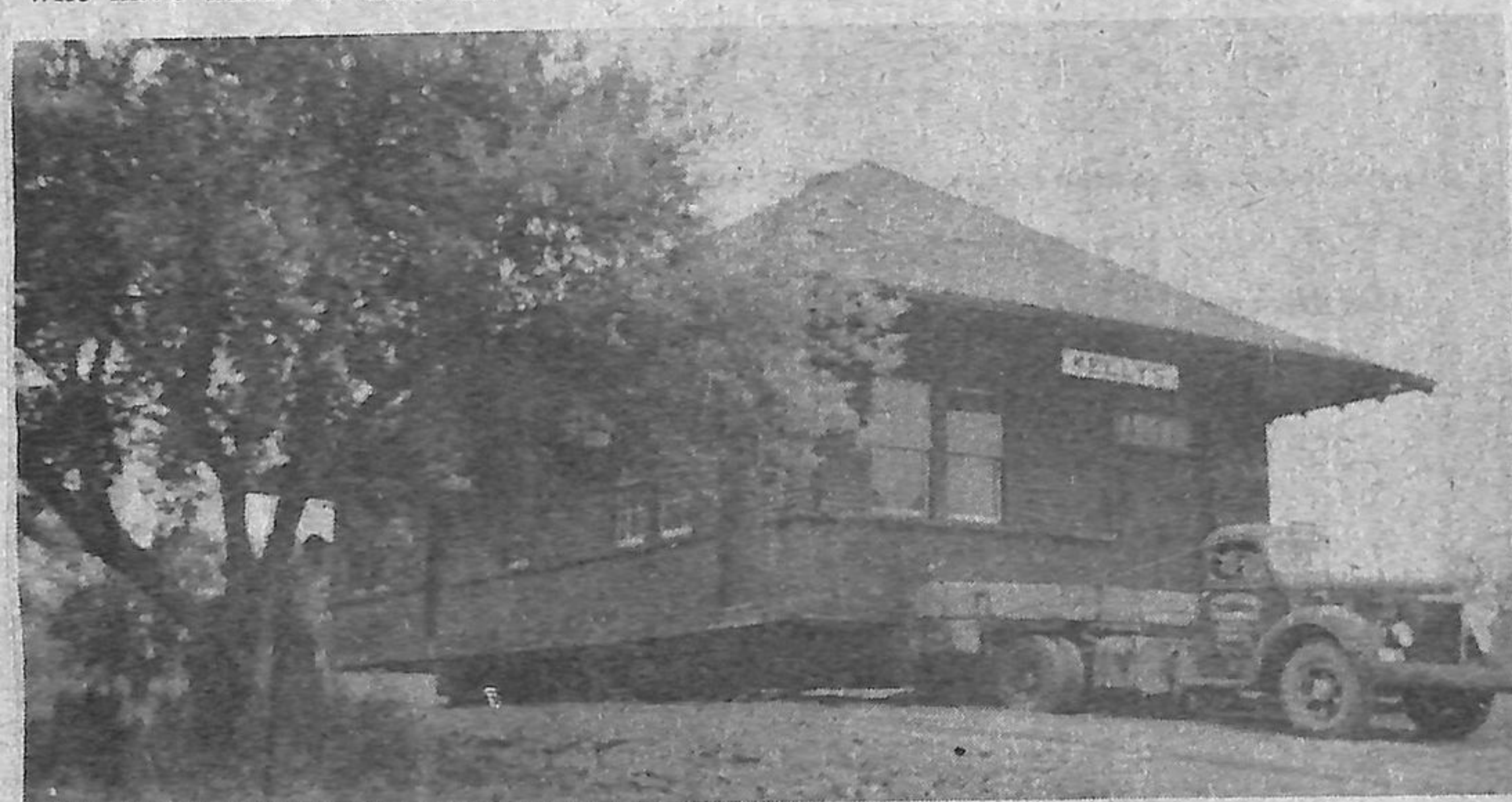
Former Kellys Siding Station Now A Lovely Rural Home
