The Mederia embroidery is beautiful, done on organdy, originally imported from Switzerland and the United States. The women work sitting on the floor. The finished products are washed in the cold water in the river, and beaten on the stones. Finally they are ironed with charcoal irons.

Blind people are taught caning, making string bags, and mats made from reeds.

Mrs. Kent showed slides of Pakistan - the mountains, men plowing the rice fields gleaners with oxen, following the primitive harvesting of grain, beautiful flowers bazaars and much more.

Mrs. Kent offered for sale - tea cloths, aprons, scarves, handkerchiefs, and night gowns. These were under sponsorship of the Anglican Church of Canada and all proceeds go toward helping the Pakistan people.
