Mrs. Gertrude Milne Had Notable Career in Teaching

Residents of St. Marys and district were grieved to learn of the recent passing of Mrs. Hilton Milne, the former Gertrude Bartlett, after a brief illness. Taken ill at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Ian Mc-Laughlin of Galt, just before Christmas. She passed away in Victoria Hospital, London, on Sunday morning, February 6th. Mrs. Milne resided at Willard Court, St. Marys, having moved from the Wellburn area a few

years ago.

Born and educated in St. Marys, she was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Bartlett. She obtained her teacher's certificate at Stratford Normal School, and before her marriage to Hilton Milne of Wellburn on Sept. 27, 1930, she was a highly esteemed teacher at Cherry Grove and U.S.S. No. 15. In later years she resumed her teaching career and served at Uniondale and Kintore before joining the staff of St. Marys Public Schools as instructor in Special Education. Her work in this field was outstanding as shown by the love and respect afforded to her by her pupils. On her retirement the past June, she was honored by the Perth County Board of Education, the Teachers' Federation, and the staff of St. Marys Public Schools.

A life-long member of the United Church at Wellburn, and later St. Marys, she took a very active part in church and community affairs. With her great capacity for friendship and gracious hospitality, she will be

sorely missed.

Mourning her loss are two daughters, Lois, Mrs. James Rupke of An Arbor, Michigan; Marion, Mrs. Ian McLaughlin of Galt; two grandsons, Michael and Mark Rupke; a sister, Kathleen, Mrs. Earl Hooper of St. Marys, and a brother, Charles, of Willowdale. She was predeceased by her husband, Hilton Milne, on April 3, 1964, and a son, Donald Murray, on February 10, 1935.
