A Timeless story for Children and Adults.

"Who Has Seen The Wind" was written by W.O. Mitchell before 1947 but this story of a boy growing up in a small town on the Saskatchewan prairie is very timely in today's world. For not only does it tell of Brian trying to fathom the mysteries of life and death as he grows but also presents the people and this prairie town and how they try to cope through their difficult years - the depression 30's. The tender appeal of this book lies in that this boy, Brian, could be any small boy and the town where he lives could be any small town. W.O. Mitchell has drawn from his background to make this story from a prairie setting, a story of childhood told with tenderness and humor, realism but mostly understanding.
