the lives of not only the person with the illness, but that person's family and friends as well.

Following a brief question and answer period, the Brown's W.I. presented the Alzheimer Society of Oxford County with about 20 teddy bears.

The women were asked to either knit or donate a teddy bear to the Alzheimer Society's Cuddle Bear Program. Those who chose to knit a bear were given a kit which contained a pattern and some information about the program. The women also become a member of the Cuddle Bear Club and will receive a newsletter a few times a year.

The idea of the program is to provide some comfort to a person in the mid to late stages of Alzheimer disease or dementia. It was started by a woman in Nova Scotia who was visiting a nursing home. She saw an elderly woman with Alzheimer disease crying. When she placed the woman's teddy bear in front of her, the woman hugged the bear and stopped crying.


