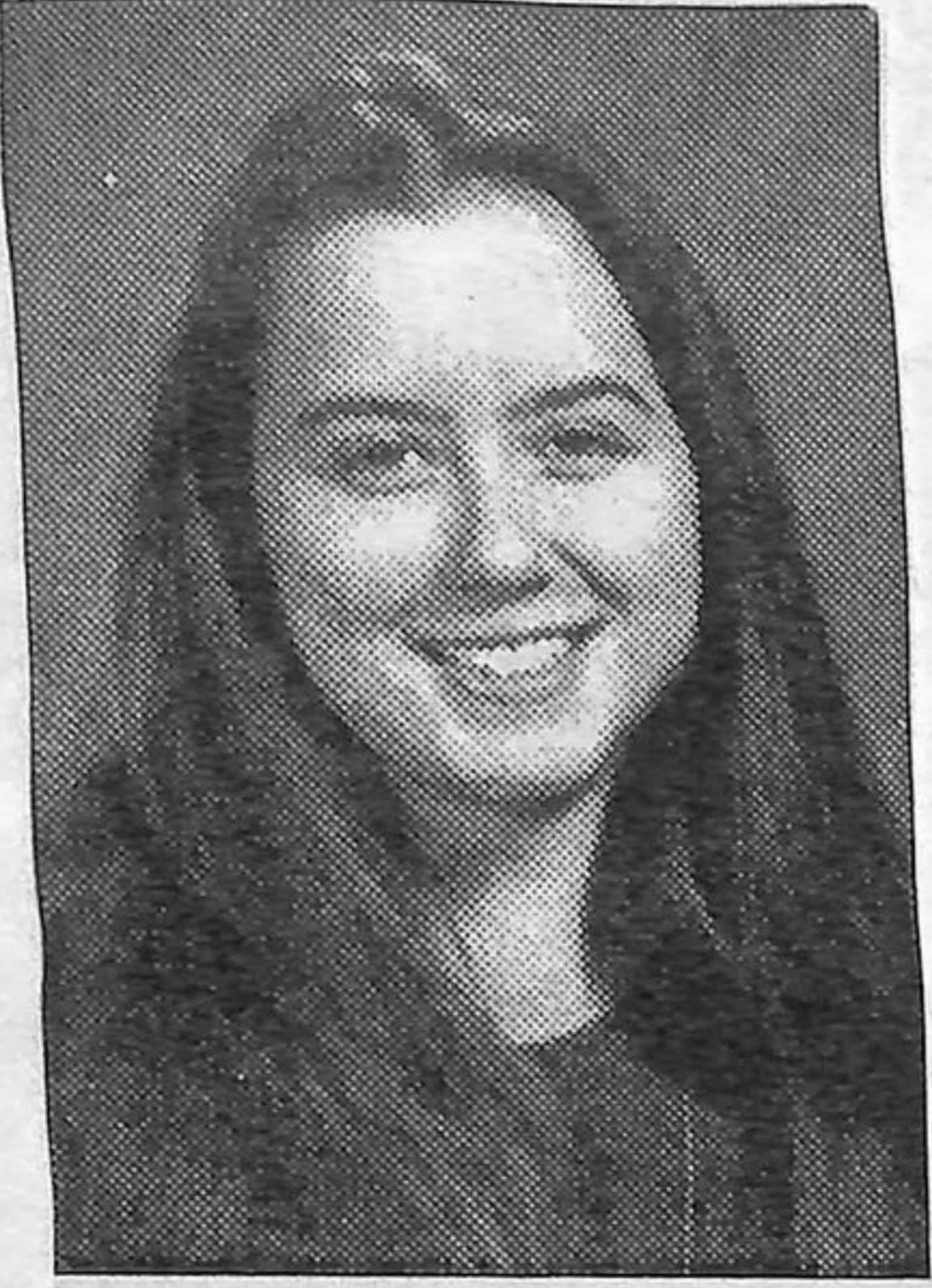


Five vie to be St. Marys Fair Ambassador 2001
