Friday October 12 with Dessert at 7 p.m. and Fashion show at 8 p.m. by Geri Fashions.

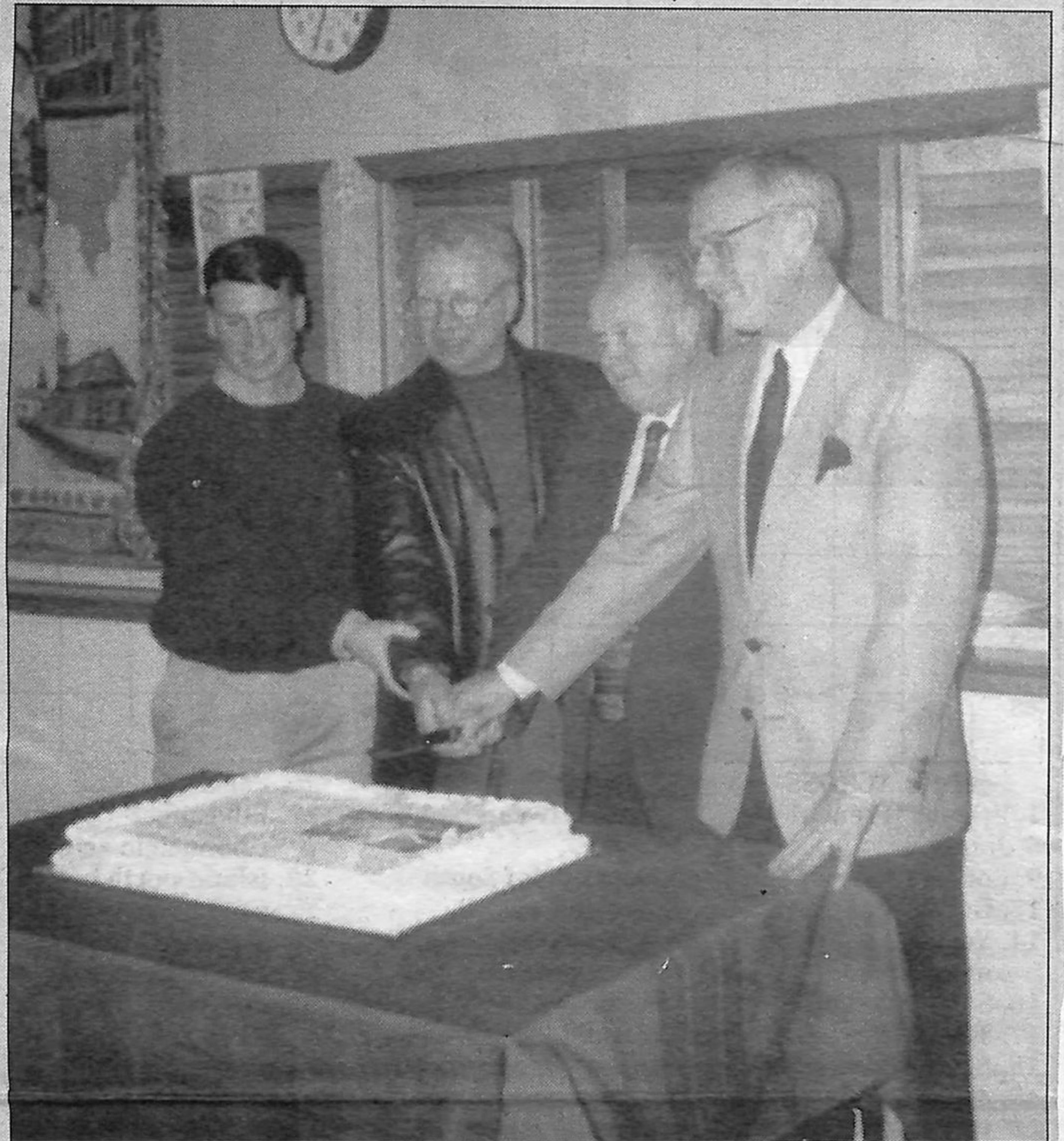
