Browns Women's Institute held their first progressive euchre party of the season on Thursday, November at Browns School.

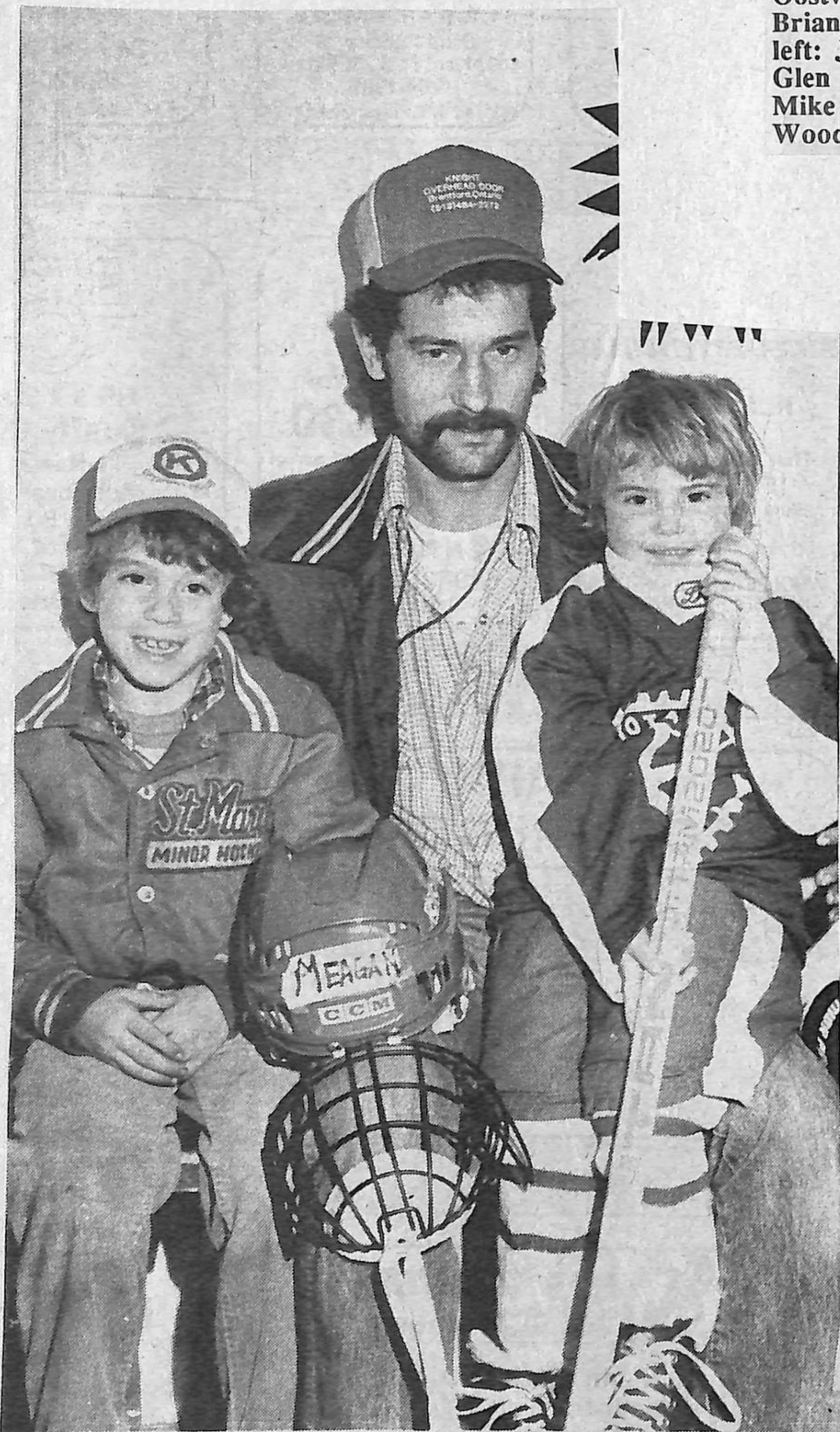
