

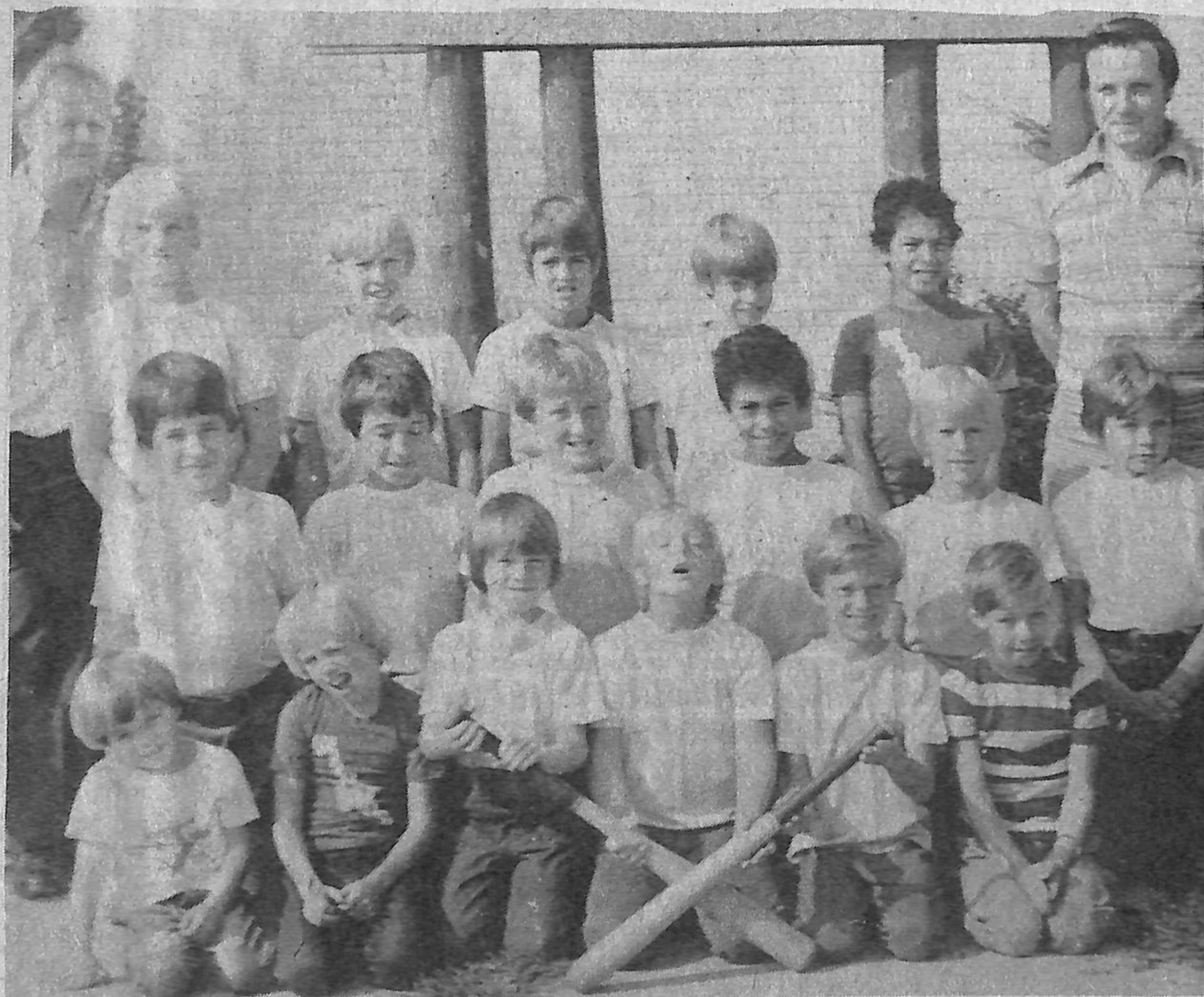


## Win Bantam Playoffs *Sept 21/77*

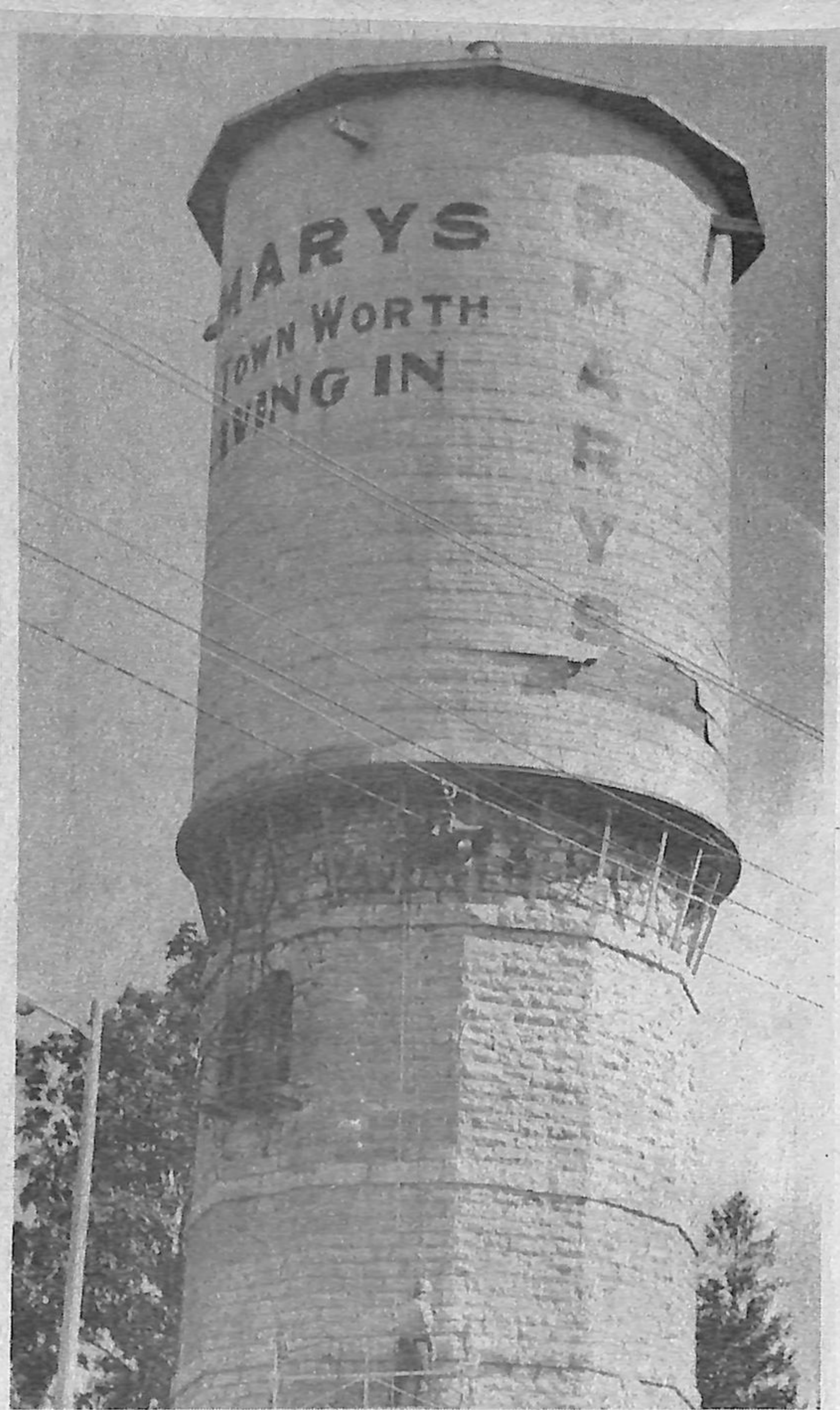
