September 10, 1942. - Mr. Donald Seaton Sr. spoke on Apples under the headings, planting, pruning, fertilizing, spraying and marketing. Elaine Showers gave a talk on rose culture and Mrs. H. Uren on Sweet Pea culture. Mrs. Carman Brown was convener of the meeting.

November, 1942 - Miss Clara Kittmer R.N. gave a splendid talk on cancer. She stressed the importance of regular physical check-ups. She said that cancer begins quietly and is not due to a germ. It is a disease of old age but young are also affected. It is not hereditary and strikes the healthy as well as the weak.

August 10, 1943 - Mrs. Fred Slater spoke on Social Welfare. She spoke of health insurance and said that a large majority of Canadians are unable to pay for medical care. Health is a national problem. In Oxford there are three public health nurses and two social service workers.
