

January 4, 1939 - The first meeting of the Glee Club was held under the direction of Mr. Harry Urstadt, organist at St. Marys United Church. This continued through the winter and was a source of great pleasure.

March 31, 1939 - The St. J. presented a play. The committee in charge was Thelma Taylor, Frances McMurray and Kathleen Elgie. Those taking part in the play were - Misses Kathleen and Luella Elgie, Thelma Taylor, Susan Muir and Frances McMurray, Mrs. Mrs. Harry Elgie Messrs. George Fowle, Murray Taylor and Douglas Muir. Proceeds from the play - \$31.00. The Play was Billy's Goat.

In 1939 - Sixty cents was spent to prepare a baby's bath tray for relief.

July 27, 1939 - An Institute picnic was held at Lakeside picnic grounds with thirty present. Helene Hakem and Grace Darling were in charge of sports. Kathleen Elgie won the highest number of prizes. Mrs. H. Uren and Frances McMurray looked after the picnic supper. Following the supper Miss Helen Mackercher spoke on the "Psychology of the Home". Expenses of the picnic were \$3.98 and the collection was \$1.93.

December 1, 1936 - Sold fourteen boxes of Christmas cards with a profit for the Institute of 20¢ a box.

January 4, 1940 - Wool was distributed to members to knit for the soldiers.

September 26, 1940 - On a motion of Mrs. T. L. McMurray and Mrs. Ann Stewart the St. J. members decided to meet every Tuesday afternoon to do Red Cross work.

January 30, 1941 - As a result of an address by R. H. Burton from Agricultural Board a group formed and held meetings in Medina school on Tuesday evenings.
