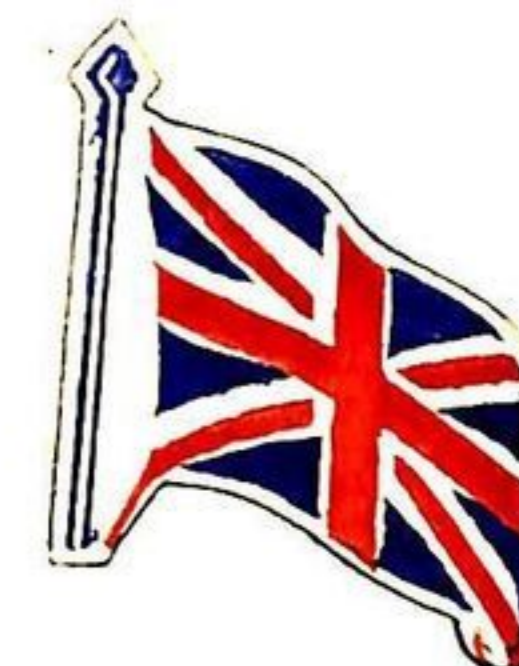
In Flander's Fields the poppies grow

Serg. J.M.Ker, wireless air gunner with R.C.A.F. overseas, who has been reported missing on active service. Sergt. Jack Ker who is 24 years old, was born at Brownsville, the son of Mr. and Mrs. M.H. Ker. He received his Education at the Brownsville Public and Continuation School, after which he was an employee of the Borden Company until his enlistment for active service. He was a member of the Oxford Rifles, Woodstock, in 1940 and enlisted with the R.C.A.F. in February 1941. He received his elementary training in Toronto and was a member of the precision squad which drilled before the C. N. E. grandstand in 1941. On April 10, 1942 he graduated from the Guelph Wireless school and the following day he was married to E. Doris Fugard, Ingersoll. Early last May he graduated from the Fingal bombing and gunnery school and went overseas on May 24. Sergt. Ker is a member of Brownsville United Church and Sunday School; also the Young People's Society. He took an active interest in the Brownsville Boy Scout Troop and was a keen participant in sports and all activities of the community.

This picture of Sergt. Hall appeared in the Christmas issue of The Canadian Milky Way, a publication for employees of The Borden Company, Limited. It was taken during his leave in England. He enlisted in 1940 and started his training on January 3, 1941. He received his training at Toronto, Montreal and Jarvis going Overseas on November 3, 1941. He had made many successful trips
