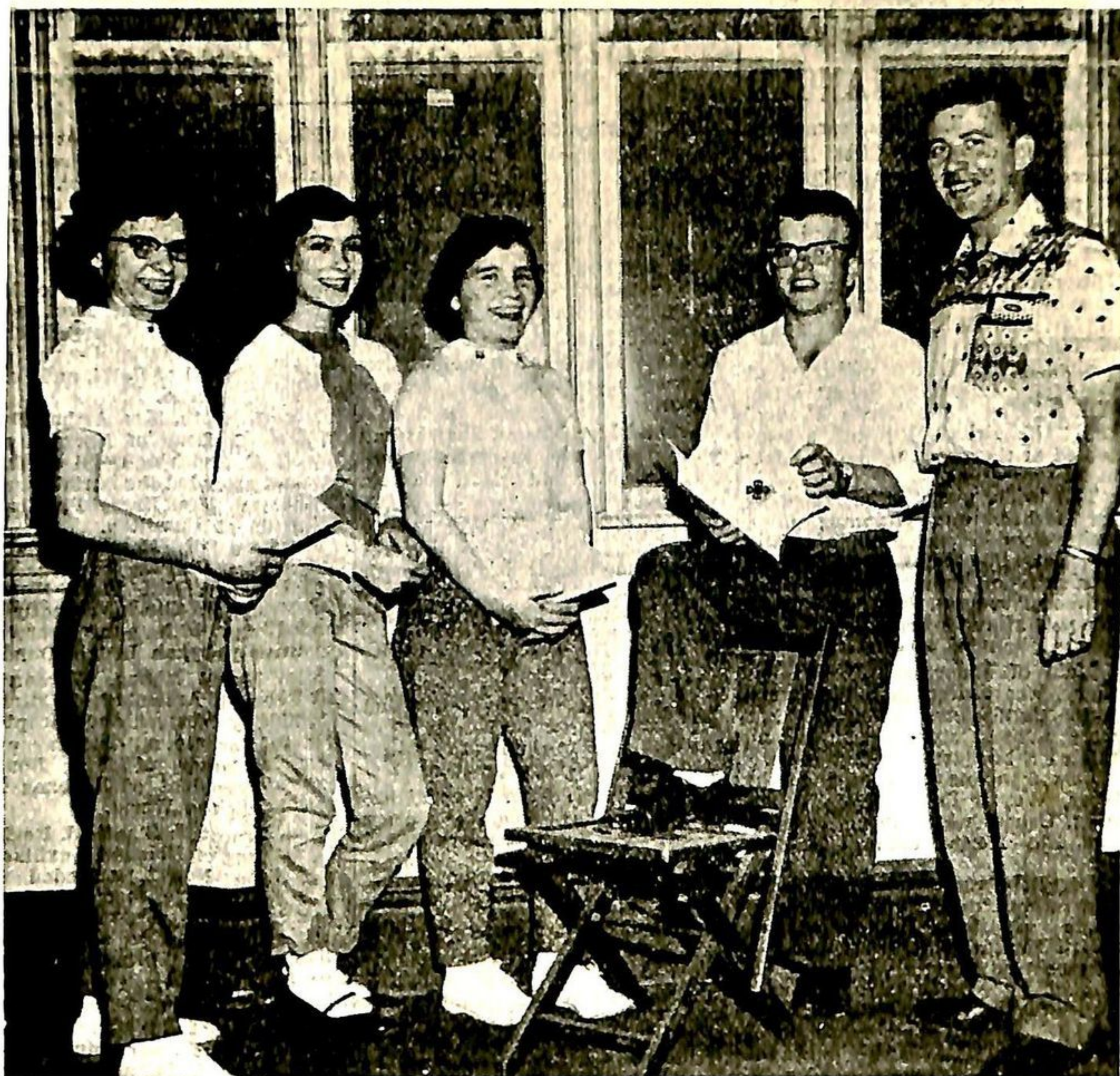

## Achievement Day Held By Oxford 4-H Clubs

WOODSTOCK, Oct. 19 — Oxford County 4-H corn clubs' achievement day was held in the recreation hall at Woodstock fairgrounds Saturday with four clubs exhibiting and 40 club members in attendance. Norman O. Watson, assistant agricultural representative for Oxford, was in charge.

Each contestant exhibited 10 ears of corn selected from his acre plot, and judged one class of corn, one class of cereal grains and one class of clover or grass seed. A written examination based on 4-H club work and cultural practices studied during the year completed the day and counted as credits on the year's work.

Beverley Burrill, placing first in the Norwich 4-H Club, also topped all contestants with the best exhibit.

Other first prize winners were: John Lawrence of the Embro and Bennington Club; Wally Williamson, Tillsonburg; Bruce Scott, of South Zorra.
