The Women's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church was organized at the home of Mrs. James Lambden, August 12, 1909, four years after the corner stone of the Church was laid in May, 1905.

Mrs. A.E. Lloyd, of Corinth, district organizer, was also present. She has since passed away, Her husband, Rev. A.E. Lloyd, resides in St. Thomas.

Rev. and Mrs. Kaine were resident pastor and wife of this circuit at that time.

Box socials and other socials were held to raise funds. At the first social, November 16, 1910, there were prizes given for the best cake. The White Layer Cake prize was 25¢ and a cup and saucer. The Chocolate Cake prize was 15 and a pair of salt and pepper shakers. The Spanish Bun Cake prize was 10¢. The proceeds from this social were \$10.66.

Interest in the work grew. By 1919, there were 20 members. By 1921 there were 38 active members and 2 associate members. By 1922 there were 42 active members and 2 associate members. In 1926 there were 47 members - 39 active, 6 life and 2 assoc. In 1959 there were 41 members - 35 active, 4 life, and 2 assoc.
