chosen to get prices on a carpet for the Chancel of the Church and upholstering for the Pulpit Chairs.

In 1962, Ostrander Furniture carpeted around the Pulpit and down the aisles.

In 1963, in February, 25 Sunday School chairs were bought at \$3.70 each.

In 1965, there were many different suggested projects to raise money. St. Patrick's Social, Strawberry Social, Turkey Suppers and Plant and Bulb sale.

In 1965, to get a supply of Tea Towels for the kitchen, roll call was to be answered with a donation of a towel.

To-day we have two U.C.W. units. The afternoon unit and the evening unit.

The U.C.W. gives great support, financially, to keep our Church alive. They ially, to keep our Church alive. They raise money with turkey suppers and they cater to weddings and Christmas they cater to weddings and Christmas suppers for other organizations. They suppers for other organizations. They also make quilts to sell and they will do quilting jobs for individuals.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL

In 1906 Fred Sypher was the Sunday School Superintendent at the Delmer Sunday School. This same year a Young Peoples' group was formed.

To-day our Superintendent is Larry
Anger. Other Superintendents in the
past years were: "r. Floyd Sanderson,
Mr. Merven Anger, Mr. George Thompson,
Mr. LeRoy Curtis and Mr. William Jensen.
The Amateur Superintendent today is
Mrs. Cecil Williamson.

Sunday School was always held in the afternoon. About 15 years ago it began to be held at 11 am following the worship service at 10 am.

For many years we had a Christmas Concerput on by the Public school Teachers and pupils. But to-day the Sunday School classes participate. Usually each class will put on their own skit. It is always enjoyed by everyone. And Good Old St. Nick outs in an appearance to bring down the curtains and wind up the evenings entertainment.

The average attendance according to the records in 1877 were 79. To-day it is around 40 who attend.

On Oct. 26, 1980 we held a combined Sunday School Worship Service to celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the beginning of Sunday Schools. It was observed with different pupils taking part. A birthday cake was served. It was cut by one of our older members, Mrs. George Green.

To commemorate the 200th Anniversary of the starting of Sunday School, Terry and Cheryl Sanderson presented an Electric Vaccuum Cleaner.
