Tribute to volunteer

An editorial tribute to the late Margaret (Brown) Kerr, former Brownsville resident, appeared recently in the Aurora Banner.

The editorial paid tribute to the volunteer work she performed in the community.

Said the editorial:

"In this day and age, when many people seem to be saying 'gimme', and demanding more money for their time, a volunteer in community activities is always a refreshing sight.

"Fewer people are giving of themselves for the good of someone else, without asking anything in return. Many community functions have been curtailed and, yes, even cancelled, simply because volunteer labor was not available.

"Aurora's community volunteer force suffered a loss Sunday with the untimely death of Margaret Kerr.

"Mrs. Kerr, who just last week had participated in the flag raising ceremony with Mayor George Timpson to mark September as Arthritis Month, died on the weekend after contracting a virus.

"Her death came as a shock to many local groups, including members of the Aurora United Church, the scouting movement, the arthritis society, and indeed, The Banner.

"We depended on Mrs. Kerr to keep us informed of the various activities in which she was involved, and had lengthy discussions on methods for publicizing the events.
