
The Early Ancestry

From research done by members of the Feaster family living in Yorkshire County, England, we are able to determine the names and origins of the Feaster ancestors back to the early 18th century. The first knowledge that we have of a direct ancestor is of a Robert Feaster, who farmed at Troutsdale, near Hackness, in Yorkshire County in the early seventeen hundreds. On examining the Family Tree (above), we see that Robert Feaster had a grandson, Robert Feaster, who farmed at Cropton, in Yorkshire, and was the father of ten children. Three of these children, John, Robert and William, came to Canada about 1849 and established the Fewster (the name was changed back to the original Fewster) families from which we are descended. Thus, Fobert Feaster (the older) was the great-grandfather of our Canadian pioneer Fewsters.
