## STEPHEN G. HAMBLIN

Stephen G. Hamblin, 70, of 2 Stover St. N., Norwich, passed away on Saturday, September 12th at Victoria Hospital, London.

Born in England, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George Hamblin, he came to Canada with his parents, residing in Mimico for 32 years. While a resident of Mimico he was a Charter member of the Lions Club, a councillor for four years and chairman of the School Board. In 1944 he moved to Chatham, living there for four years, prior to moving to Norwich in 1948, where he operated a retail meat market on Stover Street until his retirement in 1967.

Mr. Hamblin was a member of Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Norwich; St. John's Masonic Lodge No. 104, A.F. and A.M.; The Scottish Rite, Woodstock and the Lodge of Perfection, Woodstock.

He was a former secretary of the Norwich-Otterville Lions Club and a Past District Governor of the Lions; a former president of the Minor Hockey Association and a very active member; a member of the Norwich Public School Board and former chairman; a former

chairman of the Group Committee of the Norwich and District Boy Scouts and always took a keen interest in the young boys of the community.

Surviving are his wife the former Lillian Gawthorne; one daughter Mrs. Basil (Eleanor) Palamedes of Ottawa; two sons Stephen of Toronto and Edward of North Bay; also six grandchildren. He was predeceased by a daughter in May of this year and his father in December 1963, at the age of 90 years.

The funeral was held at the Arn and Son Funeral Residence on Tuesday, Sept. 15th at 1.30 p.m. with Rev. Elgin Rintoul, minister of Norwich United Church officiating.
