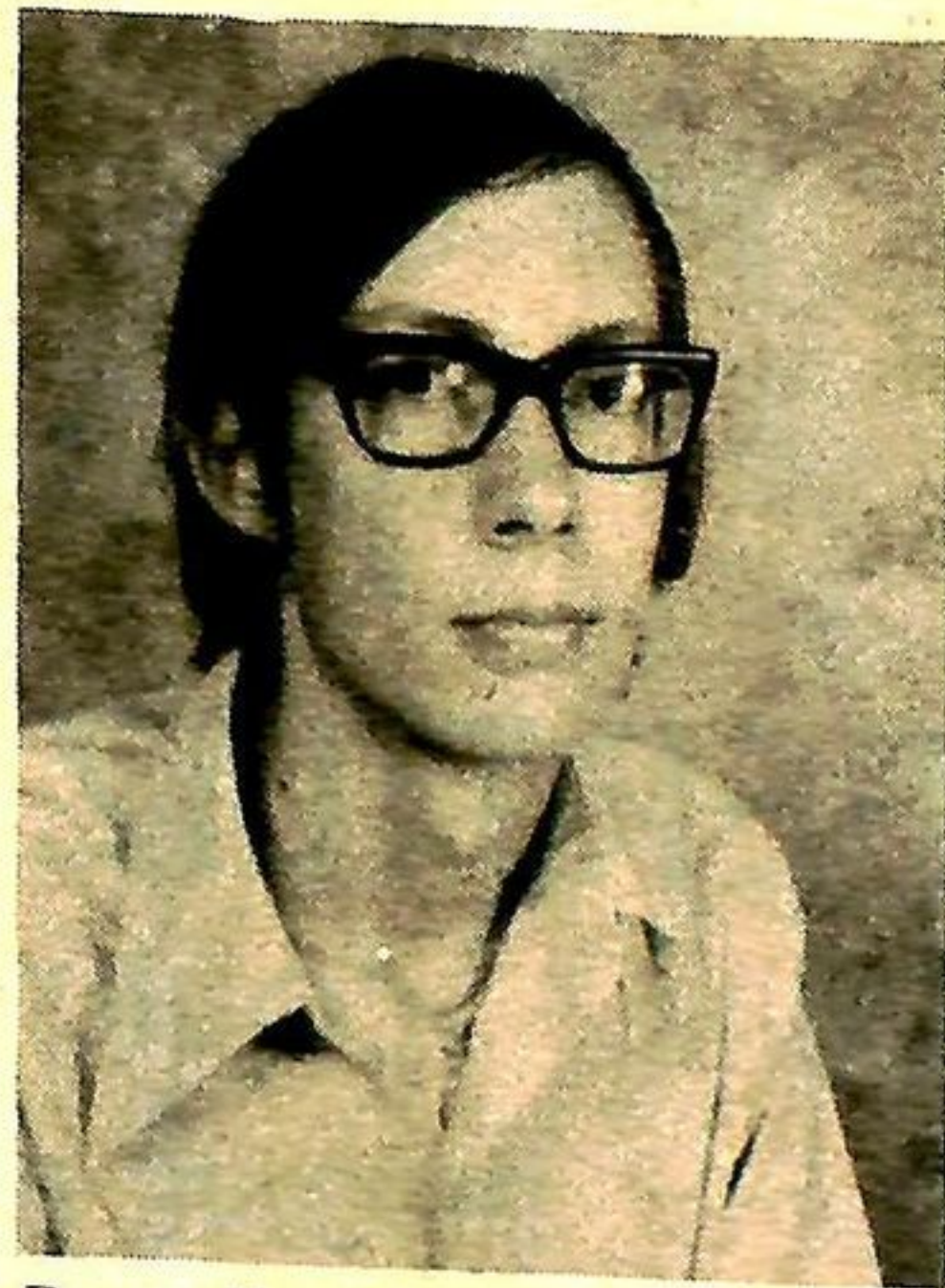
JUNE 19 - 1974

Martin and Peggy thanked all for the beautiful gifts and for remembering them at this time. A delicious lunch was served bringing a very enjoyable evening to a close.

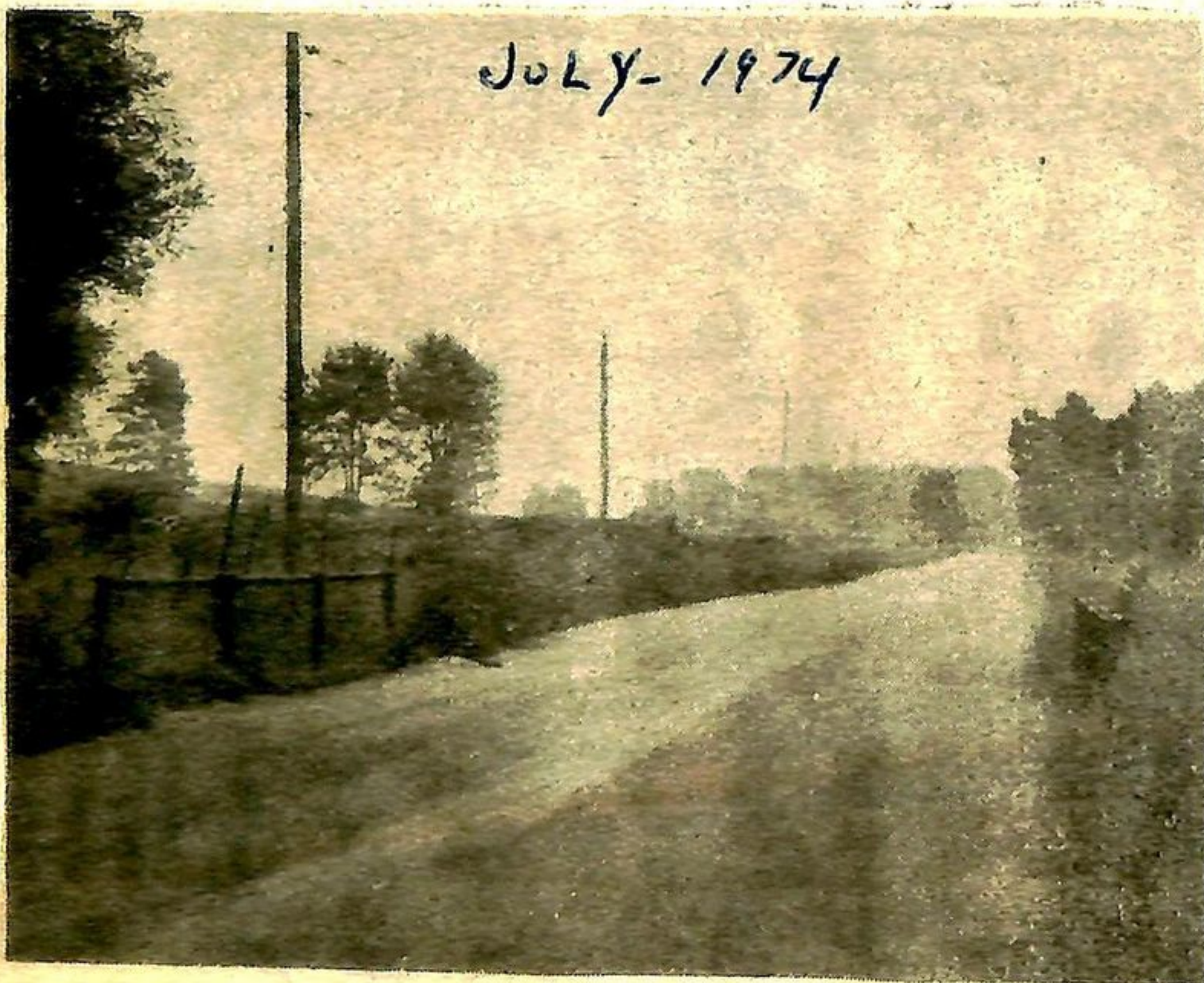
